#### **Firth Street Repairs**

If you have been in or out of Firth in the last month you know that Firth Road has been milled and overlaid. The Village Board worked with Lancaster County for several years to move the project to completion. Street patching and crack sealing of all Firth streets was completed in late summer. The south side of the intersection at Firth Road and Everett Streets is also scheduled to be redone yet this year. Due to the heavy truck traffic in that location the intersection will be replaced with concrete.

### **Recycling Issues**

The Firth Recycle Drop-Off site is provided through an interlocal agreement with the City of Lincoln. The City of Lincoln provides the bins and schedules all pickup times. Please note: ALL recyclable items MUST be placed in the appropriate bins. ALL cardboard boxes MUST be flattened before placing in a bin. With the Holiday season approaching there will likely be an increased amount cardboard dropped off. If you come to the recycle center and the bins are full please take your items home and come back another time. Or take them to a different Recycle Drop-Off site. Thank you for doing your part to keep the recycle site clean and free of litter!

The Planning Commission is currently working with FiveRule Rural Planning to update the Village Zoning and Subdivision ordinances. The update is anticipated to be completed in the spring of 2020.
